owner in the
Caribbean

1 COPY OR REPRODUCE

Anyone wishing to record your song or use it in a new movie or video game cannot do so without first receiving your permission.

2 PERFORM PUBLICLY & DISTRIBUTE

It is illegal for persons to perform a song that you own the copyright to, at a public concert or to make copies which are then distributed on the streets or placed on YouTube or other streaming music websites.

3 CREATE ALTERNATIVE SONGS

If someone wishes to translate one of your original songs to another language, or create a Reggae rearrangement of your R&B composition they too will require your permission.

4 IMPORT COPIES OF YOUR WORK

This prevents other entities from importing infringing copies of your music from other countries.

5 PUBLICLY DISPLAY YOUR CREATION

This applies to the display of lyrics on lyric videos and websites. It may also apply to your music videos.

6+7 MORAL RIGHTS

- The Right to have name prominently associated with or excluded from your song.
- The right to object to any distortion of your original intention for your song
